### DEPARTMENT OF RELIGION POLICIES

The requirements on the MA in Religion Checklist pertain to the standalone MA degree only, not the MA degree earned as part of the PhD Program.

Students must complete two Residence Units and a minimum of 30 points at the 4000-level or higher with the exception of courses taken at Union Theological Seminary. As Union Theological Seminary is a graduate school with an independent course numbering convention, courses taken at any level at Union Theological Seminary may count toward the degree. Students must maintain a GPA of at least 3.0 (B) to remain in good standing in the program. At least 30 points must be taken for a letter grade of B or better. Courses graded Pass/Fail or taken for R credit cannot be counted toward the degree.

Students must successfully complete the following required courses with a grade of B or better:

- Theory and Method in the Study of Religion (RELI GR6101, 4 points)
- Religion and Public Life (RELI 6420, 4 points)
- Capstone Writing course (RELI GR6112, 4 points)

### Examination

Students must arrange an individual oral examination based on either a thesis or an article-length scholarly paper. The exam is to be administered by a two-member faculty committee selected by the student and approved by the MA Program Director.

### Timetable

Full-time students are expected to complete the program in two to four semesters. Part-time students must complete the program within eight semesters. The requirements for the part-time MA are the same as for the full-time MA.

### Plan of Study

The plans of study below are samples only. Students should arrange their individual plans of study with a faculty advisor designated by the MA Program Director.
